“TRIUMPHANT”

ROCKINGHAM COUNTY CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS MONUMENT

ORIGINALLY ERECTED IN THE INTERSECTION OF SCALES ST. AND MOREHEAD ST.
IN DOWNTOWN REIDSVILLE, NC AND DEDICATED IN 1910,

THE ORIGINAL STATUE WAS CARVED FROM ITALIAN CARRARA MARBLE.

ON MAY 23, 2011 THE STRUCTURE WAS HIT BY A MOTOR VEHICLE AND SEVERELY DAMAGED.
THE MARBLE STATUE FELL FROM ITS PERCH ONTO THE VEHICLE AND BROKE INTO MULTIPLE PIECES.

THOSE PIECES WERE DONATED TO THE ROCKINGHAM COUNTY MUSEUM FOR DISPLAY.

THE CHIPPED EDGES AND BROKEN CORNERS OF THIS ORIGINAL GRANITE BASE STRUCTURE
WERE INTENTIONALLY LEFT UN-REPAIRED. THIS NEW STATUE WAS CARVED FROM GA. GRAY GRANITE

AND THE STRUCTURE WAS RELOCATED TO THIS SAFER LOCATION
IN 2013 BY THE NC DIVISION OF THE UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY
